## INTRODUCTION

Today is a big day in the life of Christian churches. It is essentially the birthday of Christianity as we know it. It is the day when the stories and teachings of Jesus went beyond the firsthand experience of Jesus. It is the day the disciples first started sharing the message of Jesus with new people from different lands. And from there it spread to the ends of the Earth.

## STORY OF PENTECOST

There was a lot going on in the video that may still need a little more unpacking. So we are going to go over it again, with your help.

The disciples of Jesus have been learning from the resurrected Jesus. What does resurrection mean?

To defy death. Jesus rose again after his crucifixion.

Jesus tells the disciples to wait in Jerusalem till they receive a new kind of power. What was the power called?

The Holy Spirit.

This would enable them to be faithful witnesses into all the nations. Then Jesus ascended to heaven. Meaning he is no longer physically present with the disciples.

This brings us to Pentecost. There were many people in Jerusalem at that time because Jewish people from many different nations needed to visit the temple in Jerusalem for the celebration of Shavuot or the "Feast of Weeks".

If there people are from many different countries, what would this likely mean about the languages and cultures present? (*They too would be different*). This is a very important point for us to remember as this is the grounds for the miracle of that day.

So Jesus' followers, also called	_(disciples), are all together when they hear a loud
(noise) and see what looked like _	(fire). The fire settled above people's heads but
didn't hurn like normal fire	

The fires on each person is important as they represent God's or the Holy Spirit's presence in each follower of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit or God is not just contained in an old building or box somewhere as was often represented in the Old Testament stories, but in the park.

What happened once the fires settle on the followers of Jesus? (This is our miracle).

They could speak other languages, ones they never knew before. They went out and shared the gospel stories of Jesus with others.

But there were some in the crowd who tried to dismiss what was going on. That it wasn't something from God but that they were just drunk. So Peter debunked this and shared how the prophet Joel had said God would pour out God's Spirit on them. He also spoke of Jesus and his teachings. From this event, 1000's decided to follow Jesus and the Christian movement as we know it was birthed.

## SIMILES AND METAPHORS

## **DISCUSSION:**

## 1. WHAT IS A SIMILE?

A figure of speech that involves making a comparison by liking one thing with something of a different kind. 'She is as brave as a lion.'

## 2. WHAT IS A METAPHOR?

A figure of speech in which a word or phrase is applied to an object which it is not. He is the black sheep of the family.

Often writers in the bible were trying to write about hard concepts for us to understand or see. Jesus would often use parables to make a point with a story. Some writers used similes and metaphors. When John says the Spirit came as fire, or when the Spirit descended as a dove at the baptism of Jesus. They are using metaphors and similes to help describe the Holy Spirit, which can be very difficult to describe.

3. WHAT METAPHORS OR SIMILES COULD WE USE TO DESCRIBE THE HOLY SPIRIT? (Recognising that all metaphors have their limits.) HOW DOES THIS APPLY?

## PENTECOST GAME

## **ACTIVITY:**

This is a board game that uses the experience of Pentecost as its bases. Print needed cards from the Appendix. Recommend printing the board on an A3 size for Option 1.

Rules of the game: Player rolls the die and moves that number of squares. If they land on a card square, the player on the right takes a card and reads it to the player in play. If they get it correct or complete the task before their next turn they more one square forward. If they don't get the question correct, they stay in the same place and next turn a new card is selected. The winner is the person to land on the middle square on the value of their roll.

## Option 1: (2-8 players max)

Play as individual players. Print out the board and everyone gets a game piece on the board. If there are more that 8 players have two smaller games going at the same time.

## **Option 2:** (large groups)

Use masking tape to create the board on the floor. Split into 3 or 4 teams, have one person be the game piece (identified by different party hats). Cards can be answered after team discussion but the answer given by the 'marker' is the team answer. Tasks can be completed by any team member.

## **ACTIVITY:**

## Option 3:

Hats: Pentecost hats or headbands

Using red, yellow and orange paper make hats/headbands that incorporate the flames of Pentecost.

## **Activity:** Winds of Pentecost

Using a straw to blow a ping pong ball from one side of the room to the other. This can be set up as a relay if desired.

Variation: make a swirl out of play dough on a flat surface, participants need to use their straw to blow the ball into and out of the swirl.

## Spinners:

Use the templates in the appendix. On one side at the top draw a flame, on the other side below where the flame sits draw a disciples. Fold along the dotted line. Stick a round stick on the inside behind the flame. Stick along the top edge and the other open side. When the stick is rolled between palms, the flame should appear above the head of the disciple.
